Humanist – Someone who does not believe in God, but believes there is a certain way we should live our lives. Humanism – A philosophy or a way of thinking about the world. Code for living – Rules or principles to help us to be good without a religious aspect. Morals- Knowing right from wrong Fallen - Where humans 'fell' from their place of closeness to God and so do not really show God's image in themselves as they should.</p>

We understand and respect the roles of people who help us.	We understand the consequences of our actions.	We listen to and respect other peoples opinions and values.	We try to help other people.

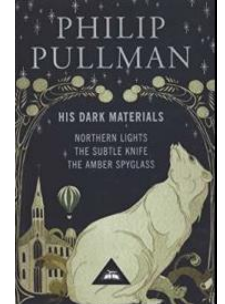
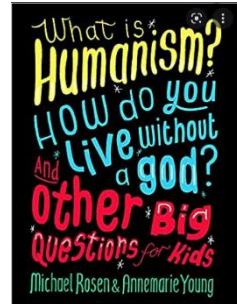
