## AFTER SCHOOL PROVISION – NEW SESSIONS AVAILABLE

We have after-school childcare available for any families who need this. The club is run by Y-Kidz and they now offer two different sessions every day. The shorter session is **until 4:30pm at a cost of £9** per day. This includes a snack and drink. **A full session is up until 6pm at a cost of £13 per day.** Children are provided with a light tea.

All sessions need to be booked and paid for in advance using their Magic Booking system.

## SAFEGUARDING

Safeguarding is a vital part of our school ethos, and it encompasses everything we do to protect children from harm, whether that be physical, emotional, or even digital. It is imperative that we all work together to create a safe environment, where every child feels secure and supported.

Should you have any concerns regarding a child's safety or well-being, we encourage you to talk to our dedicated safeguarding team. They are here to listen and will take your concerns seriously, ensuring that every matter is handled confidentially and sensitively.

In addition, we urge you to work with us in promoting a culture of openness and trust. Keeping the lines of communication open between parents and staff is essential. If you notice any signs that a child may not be feeling safe or if there are changes in their behaviour, please don't hesitate to share this information with us. Remember, your vigilance can make a significant difference in a child's life.

Over the next few weeks, we will be reminding the children about ways to keep themselves safe including key messages from the NSPCC such as 'Speak Out, Stay Safe' and the PANTS rule. We will also be discussing the worry boxes we have in classes and ways children can keep themselves safe online. All children will be going through our Acceptable Use of the Internet agreement and these will be shared with you at Parents' Evenings later in October.

### \*\*\*IMPORTANT – WE ARE A NUT FREE SCHOOL\*\*\*

A reminder that we have a small number of children in school with nut allergies so it is crucial we work together to ensure no child brings any nut products into school. Even minor traces of nut oils can cause dangerous allergic reactions in those with nut allergies.

Please help us by not sending in any foods containing nuts for snacks, lunch boxes or birthday treats. This includes items such as Nutella in sandwiches.

The cost of school dinners for children in Key Stage 2 is **£2.65 per day** (except for those receiving Free School Meals). This **must be paid in advance**, preferably using the online payment system. If you think your child may be entitled to Free School Meals, please email the office who can send you the relevant forms

We do have a breakfast club open to all children which takes place in the Infant Hall.

Arrival from 7:30am onwards - £4.50 per day

A reminder that infant children must be picked up by someone who is at least 16 years old.

We will be sending out our annual pupil information update forms shortly. It is important that we have up-to-date contact information for all pupils for safeguarding reasons. Please return these as soon as possible in the envelopes provided.



## SCHOOL UNIFORM

It is lovely to see the children looking so smart in their school uniforms.

Just a reminder that **school uniform consists of:**

- a burgundy jumper/cardigan (with or without the school logo)
- white shirt/polo shirt
- black/grey trousers or skirts
- black/grey pinafore dress or red and white checked/striped dresses in summer
- black shoes



**Jewellery** may not be worn except watches, stud earrings and any items of religious observance. **Nail varnish** is not permitted for school along with any make-up/nail extensions etc. **Hair styles** should be moderate and hair dye is not permitted unless in exceptional circumstances.

**PE kit consists of:**

- plain white t-shirt
- black/navy blue/grey shorts
- plain tracksuit for outdoor PE (navy or black or grey)
- plimsolls for indoor PE (trainers may be worn for outdoor PE)

All jewellery **must** be removed for PE for health and safety reasons. Earrings should only be covered with tape/plasters if they have been pierced in the last six weeks; otherwise they should be removed. Sweatbands should be used to cover religious bangles.

Pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 should bring their PE kit to school in a named bag. They will get changed for PE lessons in school. Pupils in Y3-6 should come to school wearing their PE kit on their allocated PE days.

If you have any difficulty covering the cost of school uniform, please get in touch with our Pastoral Team who will be happy to help. We have stocks of good quality second-hand uniform in school.



## CLASS DOJO

All classes are up and running on Class Dojo and all parents should be able to access their child's behaviour record.

Remember that you can message class teachers or the school account with any quick reminders or messages but **any absences must be reported to the School Office - not through Class Dojo.**

Also, bear in mind that teachers will usually only respond to messages during the school day as they have many after school commitments.

## STAFF NEWS

We would like to welcome Mr Mountney to Redwood who has joined our Year 5 team. We know you will all make him feel very welcome.

In other news, this will be Mrs Dingle's very last term at Redwood as she has taken the decision to take early retirement at Christmas. She is our longest-serving staff member having worked at Redwood for 35 years! We look forward to hearing about all of your memories of Mrs Dingle and will be organising a very special 'farewell' later in the term.



## ATTENDANCE

Every moment in school counts and days missed add up quickly. Evidence shows that pupils who have good attendance enjoy better wellbeing and school performance than those who don't.

There are only a few circumstances where a child is allowed to miss school, such as illness or where the school has given permission because of an exceptional circumstance.

However, if your child misses school without a good reason, local councils and schools can intervene and you may be issued a fine.

**Please note:** The DfE does not consider a need or desire for a holiday or other absence for the purpose of leisure and recreation to be an exceptional circumstance.

Since August 2024, there has been a single consistent national threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England of 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period. These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of a combination of any type of unauthorised absence.

- The fine for school absences across the country will be **£80 per parent per child if paid within 21 days**, or **£160 per child per parent if paid within 28 days**.
- In the case of repeated fines, if a parent receives a **second fine** for the same child within any three-year period, **this will automatically be charged at the higher rate of £160**.
- Fines per parent will be capped to two fines within any three-year period. Once this limit has been reached, other action like a parenting order or prosecution will be considered.
- If you're prosecuted and attend court because your child hasn't been attending school, you could get a fine of up to £2,500.



## SWIMMING

When we ask children what we could do to improve our school, the answer is almost always “add a swimming pool on to the field”! We can't quite manage that but, in exciting news, we will be having a ‘pop-up pool’ in school during December!

Instead of children in Y3/4 going to Lonsdale Pool on a weekly basis, children in Year 4 will be having daily lessons for 4 weeks. Some children in Y5/6 may also have some ‘catch-up’ sessions. There is lots of research about intensive swimming programmes being more successful in teaching children to swim which is an important life skill to keep them safe in the future.

We are sure there will be lots of questions about this exciting news but we will share more details closer to the time for those involved.

## RELIEF MIDDAY SUPERVISORS

We are always in need of relief midday supervisors who can cover absence etc. You do not need any previous experience to join our friendly team of lunchtime staff – you just need to enjoy spending time with children and do your best to help them have happy and safe playtimes. So, if you are flexible and could provide lunchtime cover at short notice, please speak to a member of the office team who will be able to provide you with an application form.
