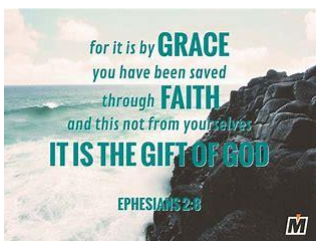


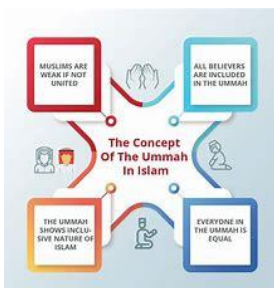
Facts	I can...	Key Vocabulary
<p>Hindu – Hindus are committed to Ahimsa, or harmlessness. They try to live life without killing or harming anything that lives.</p> <p>Christian – Christians are committed to believing in God’s grace, or generosity. They think God forgives everyone who truly repents.</p> <p>Muslim - Muslims are committed to being part of the global ‘Ummah’, the worldwide Muslim family. Often vegetarian</p> <p>Grace - is God’s “unmerited” favour, or where God shows goodness toward those who have no reason to expect it and may not deserve it.</p> <p>Ummah – the community of Islam</p> <p>Committed - pledged or bound to a faith or cause</p> <p>Sewa - ‘selfless service’. It involves acting selflessly and helping others in a variety of ways, without any reward or personal gain.</p> <p>Mohandas Gandhi - leader of India’s independence movement. When India was a colony of Great Britain, Gandhi used nonviolent methods to protest against British rule. His efforts earned him the title Mahatma. Mahatma means “great soul.”</p>

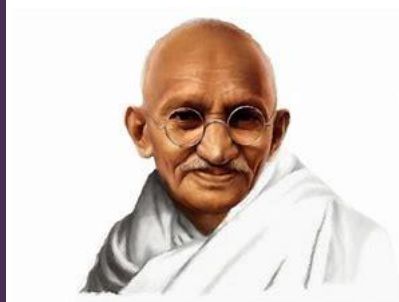
